Initial Training Requirements:

Activated Insights does meet initial training requirements.

- Home attendants who provide direct personal care must complete specialized training for their specific roles, along with proving their skill by passing a competency exam created by the home care agency or registry.
- **Note:** Training needs may vary for caregivers serving Medicaid recipients or under state-specific waiver programs. Please contact us to explore possible solutions to address these program-specific training requirements.

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Home Health Aides - Certified Nursing Assistant

Link to regulation: Title 42-Chapter IV- Sub G -Part 484- Subpart B

Federal /State Initial Certification Training Requirements:

Activated Insights does not meet federal initial training requirements.

- Federal Training Regulations require Home Health Aides to **become certified through an approved school/training program** that includes a minimum of **75 hours** of training and **16 hours** of clinical training.
- Per the Pennsylvania state regulations to become a professional home health aide one must complete either of the following:
 - Complete training and evaluation programs as per federal regulations.
 - Attend a nurse aide training program approved by the state at a home health care agency and complete a set number of hours of practical training and classroom education. After passing an exam and competency test, you are eligible for a certificate.

Ongoing Training Requirements:

- Home health aides must complete 12 hours of in-service training per year.

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Hospice Aides - Certified Nursing Assistants also referred to as HHA Link to regulation: <u>eCFR: 42 CFR Part 418 -- Hospice Care</u>

Federal/State Initial Training Requirements:

Activated Insights does not meet the Federal initial training requirements.

• Hospice Aides in Pennsylvania are often required to be certified as Home Health Aides (HHAs) or Certified Nursing Assistants (CNAs). They must complete the same **75-hour** training required for HHAs.

Federal/State Ongoing Training Requirements:

Activated Insights does meet the ongoing training requirements.

- A hospice aide must receive at least **12 hours** of in-service training during each 12-month period. In-service training may occur while an aide is furnishing care to a patient.
